SAFE House Training: The SAFE (Sisterhood Alliance for Freedom and Equality) Housing Network launched in 2018 by A New Way of Life (ANWOL). In August 2025, ReNforce staff attended the SAFE House Training in Los Angeles, CA—an intensive three-day experience built around ANWOL's uniquely successful women's reentry model.

This training equipped our team with best practices, hands-on strategies, and a comprehensive blueprint to bring back to Augusta, GA—



further strengthening our ability to transform lives through safe housing and reentry support.
